B. TO MAINTAIN CERTIFICATION	
<b>GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be an active USTA member</li> <li>• Compliant with the USTA's Safe Play program</li> <li>• Compliant with the USTA's vision requirement</li> </ul>
<b>OFFICIATING REQUIREMENTS:</b>	<p><b>Serve two days as a Roving Umpire at any of the following competitions:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• USTA</li> <li>• ITA</li> <li>• ITF World Tours: Men's, Women's, Juniors, Seniors, or Wheelchair</li> </ul> <p><b>OR</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pass an annual Roving Umpire knowledge check while holding a USTA Certification in a discipline other than Roving Umpire at any tier level</li> </ul>
<b>EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Earn the required amount of continual learning credits during the Certification Period as determined and communicated by the USTA Officiating Department</li> </ul>
